### **Commencement Mass**

Saturday May 14 at 5 p.m. – Joyce Center - Purcell Pavilion

Guest and student tickets are NOT required

Guests may begin entering the main entrance (Gate 9) at 3:30 p.m. Seating is on a first-come, first-serve basis and subject to capacity.

Please arrive early for best seating. When the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion is filled, guests will be directed to the overflow locations within the Joyce Center.

### **Student Mass Instructions**

Cap and gown is required

3:45 p.m. - Enter through the designated gates below:

- Architecture – (GA/UG) – Gate 2; proceed to The Pit gym located between Gates 1 and 2
- Arts & Letters (UG) – Gate 10
- Engineering (GR/UG) - Gate 2; proceed to The Pit gym located between Gates 1 and 2
- Graduate School - Gate 2; proceed to The Pit gym located between Gates 1 and 2
- Keough – Gate 2; proceed to The Pit gym located between Gates 1 and 2
- Law – Gate 2; proceed to The Pit gym located between Gates 1 and 2
- Mendoza (GB/UG) – Gate 8; proceed to the intramural gym above Gate 8
- Science (GR/UG) – Gate 8; proceed to the intramural gym above Gate 8

### **University Commencement Ceremony**

Sunday, May 15 at 9 a.m. - Notre Dame Stadium

Student tickets are NOT required

Guest Tickets - Your Commencement e-tickets for Sunday morning's University Commencement Ceremony in Notre Dame Stadium will be emailed to your Notre Dame email address during the week of May 9. Please check your email and forward these e-tickets to your invited guests. As a reminder, your guests must present their e-ticket in order to be admitted to the stadium ceremony.

Severe weather guest e-tickets for the University Commencement Ceremony will be emailed to your Notre Dame email address on Wednesday, May 11. These will be red in color and clearly marked "Severe Weather". More information about Severe Weather plans can be found on the Class of 2022 Commencement website.

Stadium gates open for guests at 8 a.m. on Sunday, May 15. Guests may enter Gates A, B, D, or E. Every guest must present an e-ticket.

## **Student Instructions**

8:30 a.m. - Students meet at their college/school designated area as shown below.

A cap and gown is required to participate in the Procession.

- Architecture – (GA/UG) – Geddes Hall (enter south doors)
- Arts & Letters (GR) – O’Shaughnessy Hall – Great Hall (enter west doors)
- Arts & Letters (UG) – DeBartolo Hall (enter south doors)
- Engineering (GR/UG) - Fitzpatrick Hall (enter west doors)
- Keough – Hesburgh Library (enter west door)
- Law – Law School – Archway
- Mendoza (GB/UG) – Hesburgh Library (enter north doors)
- Science (GR/UG) – Jordan Hall of Science – (enter south doors)

Students who would like to be seated beside a friend within their college/school should ensure these individuals are directly in front or behind them in line.

8:45 a.m.–Student procession begins

9 a.m. – Students will process through the North Tunnel and onto the field. Students will be directed by Faculty Marshals to assigned seating sections by college/school.

9:30 a.m. – University Commencement Ceremony begins.

11:30 a.m. (approx.) - University Commencement Ceremony ends. The Platform Party will recess out of the stadium followed by the faculty.

All students should remain seated and will be dismissed after the Platform Party and faculty have exited.
