Commencement Weekend at Notre Dame is a time to celebrate degrees earned and honors bestowed. We are very happy to have you on campus and hope that you and your graduate have a memorable weekend. If the Severe Weather Plan is implemented, the University Commencement Ceremony will move to the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion. Each graduate has been issued a limited number of Severe Weather Guest Tickets. All of the college, school, or department diploma ceremonies have covered locations.

MEDICAL COVERAGE

For medical emergencies at any time of day or night, dial 911 from any campus phone, or (574) 631-5555 from cell phones. The Notre Dame Fire Department and an ambulance will be dispatched to the scene by Notre Dame Police Department. An ambulance will be dispatched following medical dispatch protocols.

First Aid will be available at various locations on campus throughout the duration of Commencement Weekend. If an issue arises, please approach any Usher, Guest Services Team member, or NDPD Officer and they will direct you to the nearest First Aid location.

PARKING

Parking is extremely limited on the central campus, especially near residence halls. If you will be a resident on campus during Commencement Weekend, we request that you unload your vehicle and immediately move it to one of the many perimeter lots. (Do not leave anything of value visible in your parked vehicle.)

Perimeter lots include: Rugby and Wilson Lots (east of Grace Hall); Bulla Lot (corner of Bulla Road and Twyckenham Drive); Joyce Lots (south of the Joyce Center and Stadium); and Dorr and Lake Lots (west of the Rockne Memorial). See back cover for a parking map.

For safety, please do not park in any driveway, roadway, fire lane, or any reserved locations. Cars parked illegally on campus may be towed at the owner's expense.

Recreational vehicles are prohibited from parking on central campus and are not allowed to park on any University property overnight. Additional parking restrictions may be in

Commencement Ceremony in the Notre Dame Stadium, we suggest that women be cautious in regards to spiked heels (shorter, wider heels, or flats are recommended).

In the event of rain at the University Commencement Ceremony in the Stadium, a rain poncho will be provided to all graduates. However, you may also wear your own rain gear. In each case, the cap and gown is still required.

Guests: Comfort is the key. Let the weather be your guide. In May, South Bend area weather conditions and temperatures can vary greatly.

In the event of rain, the University Commencement Ceremony will remain outdoors at the stadium. Guests should come prepared and use personal rain gear, such as ponchos. Umbrella use inside Notre Dame Stadium is discouraged.

Guests: Tickets are **not** required and guests may begin entering the main entrance (Gate 9) at 3:30 p.m. When the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, seating is filled, guests will be directed to the overflow location in the Joyce Center, North Dome. In the North Dome, you can view the Commencement Mass live on video screens and fully participate, including Communion.

Graduates: Begin assembling at their specified locations at 8:30 a.m. The graduate lines leave these locations by 8:45 a.m. Cap and gown is required.

Guests may select their seats on the east or west side of the Stadium at the direction of the stadium ushers. Ushers will direct seating by sections, making certain that seats are efficiently used to assure the best viewing opportunities for all attending.

Guest e-tickets are not valid for use in the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, if the Severe Weather Plan is implemented.

Guests with Special Needs: By prior arrangement for guests needing assistance, Special Needs e-tickets for the University Commencement Ceremony are issued as needed. Guest e-tickets are issued to graduating students via their Notre Dame email address during the week of May 9. The bearer of the Special Needs e-ticket will be admitted through Gates A, B, D, or E of Notre Dame Stadium. Ushers will be available at those entrances for guests who may require assistance.

The Special Needs e-tickets are not valid for use in the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, if the Severe Weather Plan is implemented. All guests require a Severe Weather e-ticket for admission to this venue.

Indoor Viewing: The Sunday morning University Commencement Ceremony will be broadcast live in DeBartolo Hall, just west of Notre Dame Stadium. If the Severe Weather Plan is implemented, additional indoor viewing locations will be added and announced.

General: To preserve the dignity of the University Commencement Ceremony and the safety of those in attendance, guests are not permitted on the field level at any time before, during, or after the ceremony. Please refrain from using cell phones during any ceremony.

There are no secure locations to store or hold personal items. Bring only the items you need and can carry with you into the venue. Please review the Bag Policy and Prohibited Items on page 30-31.

Individuals who engage in inappropriate or disruptive behavior may be removed from the event with no right of re-entry.

UNIVERSITY COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY TICKETS

Graduate Tickets: Graduate tickets are not required for the Sunday morning University Commencement Ceremony in Notre Dame Stadium or Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, in case of Severe Weather.

Guest Tickets: Graduates were asked to request their guest tickets in March for the Sunday morning University Commencement Ceremony in Notre Dame Stadium. Guest e-tickets are issued to graduating students via their Notre Dame email address during the week of May 9. Guest e-tickets are not valid for use in the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, if the Severe Weather Plan is implemented.

Guests with Special Needs: By prior arrangement for guests needing assistance, Special Needs e-tickets for the University Commencement Ceremony are issued as needed. Guest e-tickets are issued to graduating students via their Notre Dame email address during the week of May 9. The bearer of the Special Needs e-ticket will be admitted through Gates A, B, D, or E. Ushers will be available at those entrances for guests who may require assistance. Guests with these e-tickets should be in their seats by 9 a.m. Elevators are located on the west side concourse.

The Special Needs e-tickets are not valid for use in the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, if the Severe Weather Plan is implemented.

Severe Weather Tickets: Each graduate, who requested guest tickets for the University Commencement Ceremony, is automatically provided a limited number of Severe Weather e-tickets. Severe Weather e-tickets are issued to graduating students separately from the University Commencement Ceremony e-tickets on May 11 via the their Notre Dame email address.

STADIUM BAG POLICY

As part of an ongoing commitment to safety and security, the University of Notre Dame will continue to institute policies on items that are permitted in and around our football stadium.

ALL items are subject to inspection upon entrance, including Diaper, Pumping, and Medical bags, blankets, purses, coats, or ponchos.

Backpacks, duffel bags, and tote bags are **NOT** permitted into the stadium.

SEVERE WEATHER PLAN

The Severe Weather Plan refers only to the Sunday morning University Commencement Ceremony. If the Severe Weather Plan is implemented, the University Commencement Ceremony will be moved from the Notre Dame Stadium to the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion.

Should severe weather threaten, **Commencement.nd.edu** will have updated information by 7:30 a.m. on Sunday morning. If the ceremony is moved to the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, or is delayed, a message will be sent to graduates using cell phones registered with the ND Emergency Alert system.

Graduates: Graduates and faculty in academic attire will be admitted to the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion, without tickets.

Guests: Each graduate, who requested guest tickets for the University Commencement Ceremony, is automatically provided a limited number of Severe Weather e-tickets. Severe Weather e-tickets are issued to graduating students separately from the University Commencement Ceremony e-tickets on May 11 via their Notre Dame email address.

SEVERE WEATHER PLAN (CONTINUED)

Only guests with a Severe Weather e-ticket will be seated in the Joyce Center, Purcell Pavilion.

Guests with Special Needs: Guests requiring special assistance who have a Severe Weather e-ticket should proceed to the main entrance (Gate 9) of the Joyce Center where they will be guided to appropriate seating.

Guests in wheelchairs should enter the center doors of the main entrance (Gate 9) for easier access to the elevator.

Seating is on a first-come, first-serve basis and subject to capacity. Please arrive early for best seating.

Alternative Viewing: The event will be broadcast live in the Joyce Center, North Dome, auditoriums in the DeBartolo Hall classroom building, and other large auditoriums in nearby buildings as announced. MAIN BUILDING STEPS

The outside front steps leading to the second floor of the Main Building cannot be used by students until after they graduate. This tradition dates back to Father Sorin, when only faculty were allowed to use the steps.

On Commencement Weekend, for the first time a student would walk down the front steps of the Main building, first to Sacred Heart Church and later down the steps again en route to graduation. The tradition of the steps being off limits until commencement originates in 19th-century porch etiquette and smoking rituals. Only after successful completion of a degree program was a student deemed equal enough to ascend the steps and to smoke on the porch with his professors.
